#### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

#### First aid measures

**Skin Contact** Flush with water for 15 minutes. If irritation persists after rinsing, get medical attention.

**Inhalation** Remove victim to fresh air. If breathing difficulty occurs or persists, get medical attention.

**Ingestion** Rinse mouth with water. Give water to dilute. Do not induce vomiting. Get immediate

medical attention. Never give anything by mouth to a semi-comatose, comatose, convulsing

or unconscious person.

#### Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

# Personal precautions No action

No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training. Keep unnecessary and unprotected personnel from entering. Do not touch or walk through spilled material. Avoid breathing vapor or mist. Provide adequate ventilation. Wear appropriate respirator when ventilation is inadequate. Put on appropriate personal protective equipment.

Avoid dispersal of spilled material and runoff and contact with soil, waterways, drains and sewers. Inform the relevant authorities if the product has caused environmental pollution (sewers,

waterways, soil or air).

Methods for containment

Stop leak if without risk. Move containers from spill area. Approach release from upwind. Prevent entry into sewers, water courses, basements or confined areas. Wash spillages into an effluent treatment plant or proceed as follows. Contain and collect spillage with non-combustible, absorbent material e.g. sand, earth, vermiculite or diatomaceous earth and place in container for disposal according to local regulations (see Section 13). Dispose of via a licensed waste disposal contractor. Contaminated absorbent material may pose the same hazard as the spilled product. Note: see Section 1 for emergency contact information and Section 13 for waste disposal.

### 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Protective Measures: Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see Section 8). Do not ingest. Avoid contact with

eyes, skin and clothing. Avoid breathing vapor or mist. Keep in the original container or an approved alternative made from a compatible material, kept tightly closed when not in use. Empty

containers retain product residue and can be hazardous. Do not reuse container.
