#### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

##### First aid measures

<b>Eye contact</b>	Flush immediately with water for 15 minutes. Lift upper and lower eyelids for complete rinsing. Get immediate medical attention.
<b>Skin Contact</b>	Flush with water for 15 minutes. If irritation persists after rinsing, get medical attention. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse.
<b>Inhalation</b>	Remove victim to fresh air. If breathing difficulty occurs or persists, get medical attention.
<b>Ingestion</b>	Rinse mouth with water. Give water to dilute. Do not induce vomiting. Get immediate medical attention. Never give anything by mouth to a semi-comatose, comatose, convulsing or unconscious person.

<b>Symptoms</b>	Causes moderate eye irritation. Skin irritation. Inhalation of spray mist may irritate upper respiratory tract. Harmful if swallowed. Capable of provoking bronchospasm in sulfite sensitive individuals with asthma.

## 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

### Precautions for safe handling

### Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

**Storage Conditions** Keep containers tightly closed and properly labeled. Containers that have been emptied will retain product residue and should be handled as if they were full.
